The ability to speak with tulips comes with great environmental and societal benefits. Tulips now have taken away to indicate to humans that they're in need of water, light or simply some more space. As their needs are expressed more clearly, they are able to live a happier and healthier life.

Socially, it turns out that plants, and particularly tulips, are very chatty, and make for great friends. Tulips are excellent listeners and when listened to carefully, give sound advice.

It shouldn't come as a surprise that Google Tulip was largely developed and tested in the Netherlands, a country that produces 12.5 billion flowers a year. In particular, the Dutch are world renowned for their tulips, and even have a world-famous flower park, called Keukenhof, which provided the perfect testing ground.

Google is uniquely positioned to solve the challenge of speaking with plants. Building on an advancement called Neural Machine Translation, we worked with Wageningen University & Research to map tulip signals to human language. After two years of training, we were finally able to add Tulipish as a language to Google Home's recently introduced Interpreter Mode.

Geology is the study of the earth, the materials of which it is made the structure of those materials and the processes acting upon them. It includes the study of organisms that have inhabited our planet. An important part of geology is the study of how earth's materials, structures processes and organisms have changed over time. Earth science or geo science includes all field of natural science related to planet earth. This is a branch of science dealing with the physical and chemical constitution of the earth and its atmosphere. Earth science can be considered to be a branch of planetary science, but with a much older history. Earth science encompasses four main branches of study/.

- ✚ The lithosphere
- ✚ The hydrosphere
- ✚ The atmosphere
- ✚ The biosphere

Each of which is further broken down into more specialized fields.

There are both reductionist and holistic approaches to earth sciences. It is also the study of earth and its neighbour in space some earth scientists use their knowledge of the plant to locate and develop energy and mineral resources . Others study the impact of human activity. On earth's environment and design methods to protect the planet, some use their knowledge about earth processes such as volcanoes, earthquakes and hurricanes to plan communicates that will not expose people to those dangerous events/.

Earth science can include the study of geology the lithosphere and the large scale structure of earth interior as well as the atmosphere, hydrosphere and biosphere

Typically earth scientists use tools from geology, chronology, physics, chemistry, geography, biology and mathematics to build a quantitative understanding of how earth works and evolves earth science affects our everyday lives.



For example:

- ✚ Meteorologists study the weather and watch for dangerous storms; Hydrologists examine water and work of floods.

- ✚ Seismologists study earth quakes and try to understand where they will strike.

- ✚ Geologists study rocks and help to locate useful minerals.

Earth scientists often work in the field, perhaps climbing mountains, exploring the sea bed, crawling through caves or wading in swamps. People use earth materials every day. They use oil that is produced from well. Metals that are produced from well; metals are produced from mines and water that has been drawn from streams or from underground.

Geologists get to travel to cool places and see cool things. They are paid to spend time and see cool things. They are paid to spend time in remote and beautiful locations. They are not stuck in one place, because they work in the field of the laboratory and the office brings a geologist comes with a lot of work and responsibility but there are so many rewarding aspects that worth it.....

**PERIODICITY OF ECLIPSES**

The eclipses of sun and moon occur during a new moon day. Why eclipse does not occur on every new moon? Because the moon orbits revolve in a plane of orbit of the earth around the sun. The angle between the planes is about five degrees. As a result a moon can pass well above or below the sun. The line of intersections is called line of nodes. The nodes move along the orbit from west to east, going completely around the ecliptic in about 19 years for eclipse to occur the moon has to be near one of the nodes. So, eclipses do not occur on very new moon and full moon days.
