TOPIC : MIMICRY IN ANIMALS

Mimicry can be defined as a situation in which virtually identical signals, emitted by two different organisms have in common at least one receiver that reacts in the same manner to both signals because it is advantageous to react in that manner to one of them (that of the model) although it may be disadvantageous too.

ADVANTAGE:

Protect a species from predators making it an anti-predator adaptation.

DISADVANTAGE:

Degrades the effectiveness of the signals used by the inedible species to warn off predators.

HISTORY OF MIMICRY:

The discovery of mimicry was in the mid 19th century by Henry Walter bates first published his theories of mimicry in 1862. Many plants and animals have been found to be mimetic. In many cases the organisms involved belong to the same class, order or even family, but numerous instances are known of plants mimicking animals and vice versa.

TYPES:

According to ruxton and speed (2005) mimicry generally occurs in two forms,

✚ **Batesian**

✚ **Millerian**

✚ **Self**

BATESIAN MIMICRY:

Batesian mimicry is a form of mimicry where a harmless species has evolved to imitate the warning signals of a harmful species directed at a predator of them both.

MILLERIAN MIMICRY:

Millerian mimicry is a form of mimicry in which two or more harmful or toxic animals develop similar appearances as a shared protective device.

SELF MIMICRY:

Self mimicry is a term for animals that have one body part that mimics another to increase survival during an attack or helps predators appear innocuous to allow the prey extra seconds to escape.

MONARCH(Butterfly):

The monarch stores a poison called cardenolides or cardiac glycosides that it gets from the plants it eats. This poison is similar to digitalis, which can be used to help people with heart problems, but can kill people if they consume too much of it.

VICEROY;(Butterfly)

Viceroy's are in fact, toxic as well as having evolved a different kind of toxin than monarchs. So this is actually called mullerian mimicry.

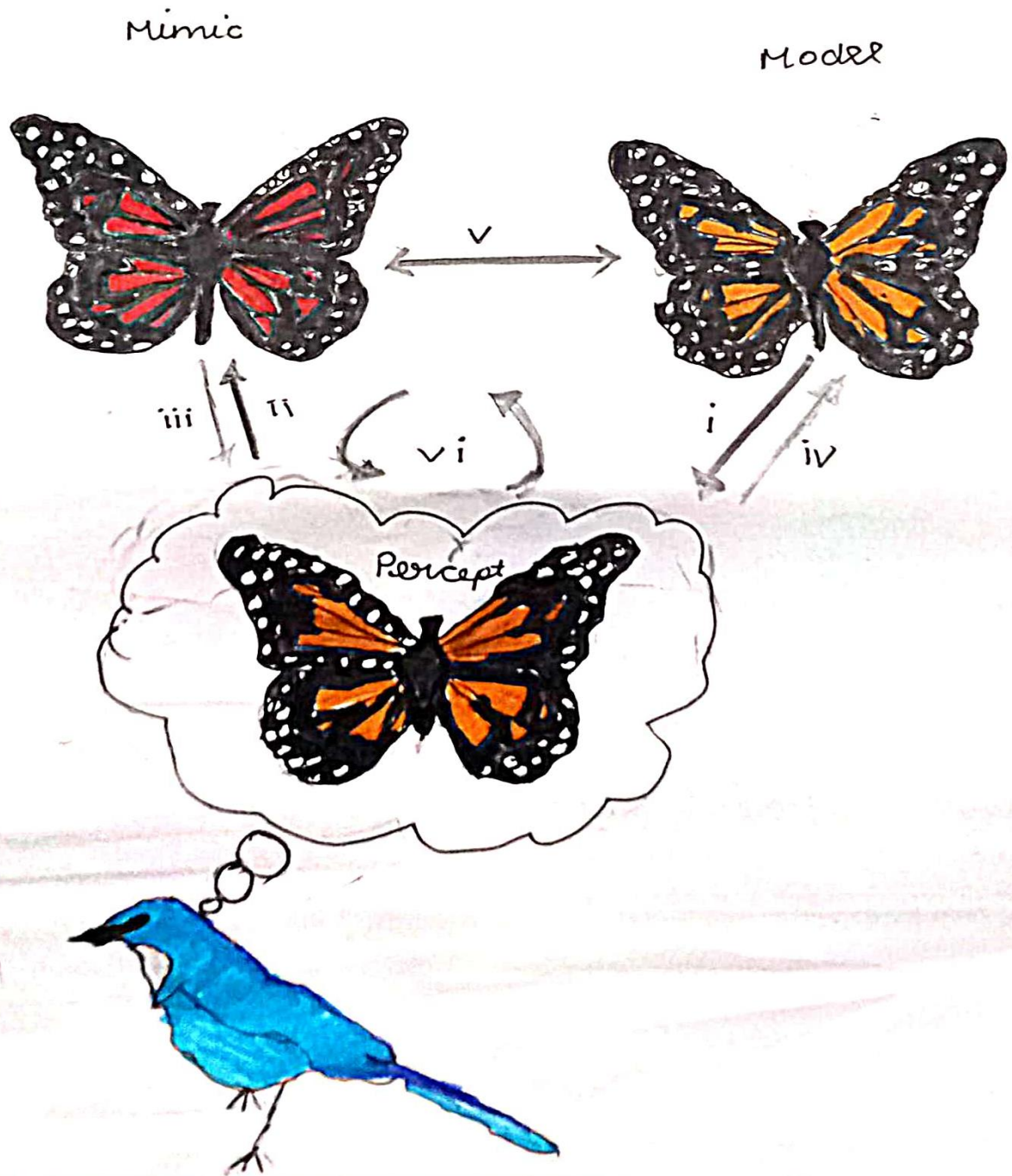
Diagram of Monarch (Butterfly)

TOPIC : **STUDY REVEALS THE OLDEST EVIDENCE OF PHOTOSYNTHESIS**

The oldest evidence of photosynthesis structure reported to date has been identified inside a collection of 1.75 billion year old microfossils a paper published in the journal nature reveals. The discovery helps to shed light on the evolution of oxygenic photosynthesis in which sunlight catalyses the conversion of water and carbon di oxide into the discovery of thyla koids in a specimen of this age suggests that photosynthesis may have evolved at some point before 1.75 billion years ago.

It does not however solve the mystery of whether photosynthesis evolved before or after the crest oxidation event similar ultra structural analyses of older micro fossils could help to answer this question the authors say and help to determine whether the evolution of thylakoids glucose and oxygen in unique to cyano bacteria and related organelles within eukaryotes cyano bacteria had an important role in the evolution of early life and were active during the great oxidation event around 2.4 billion years ago. But the timings of the origins of oxygenic photosynthesis are debated owing to limited evidence Catherine Demoulin from the university of liege, wege, Belgium and others present direct ever.

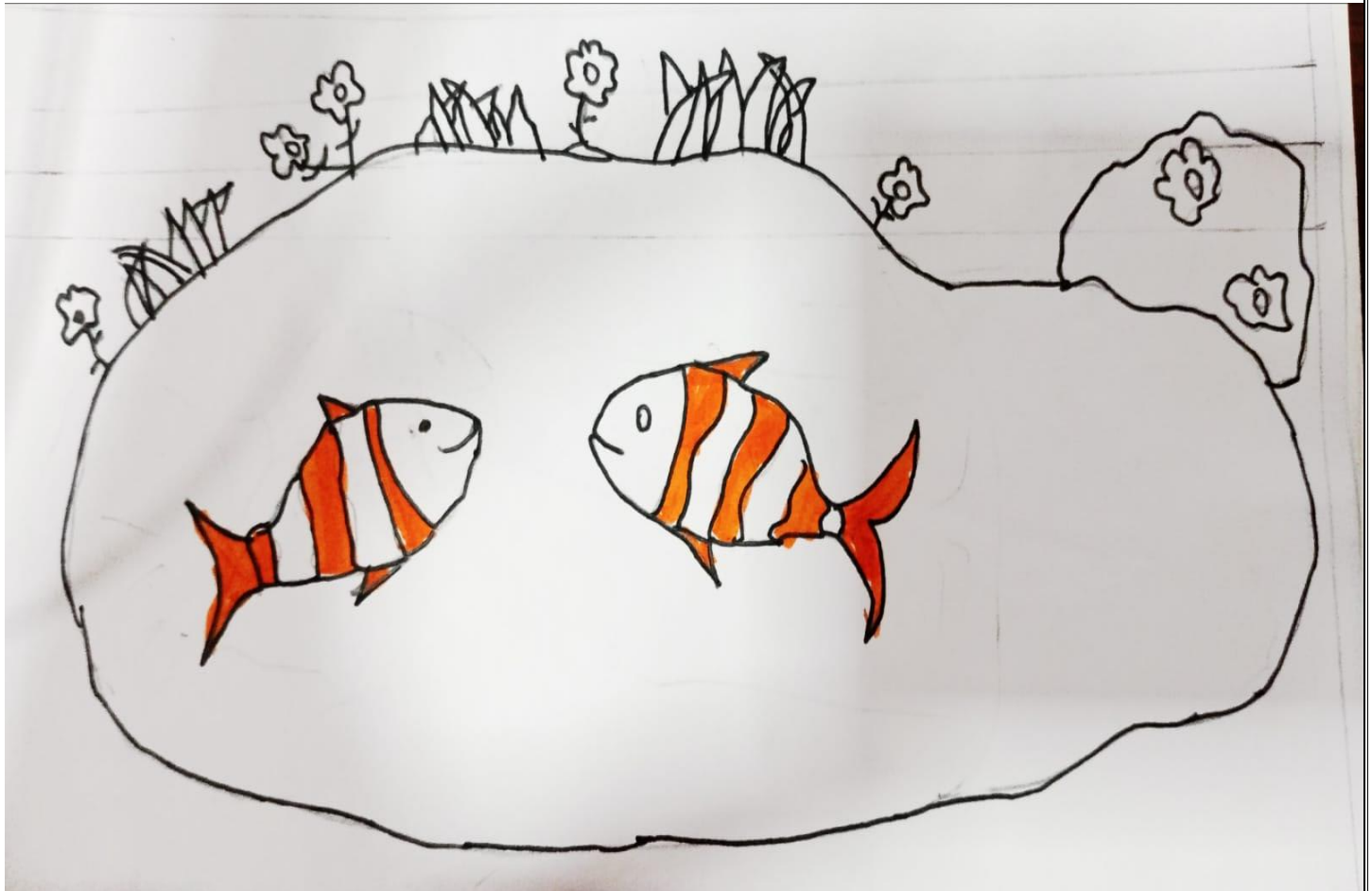

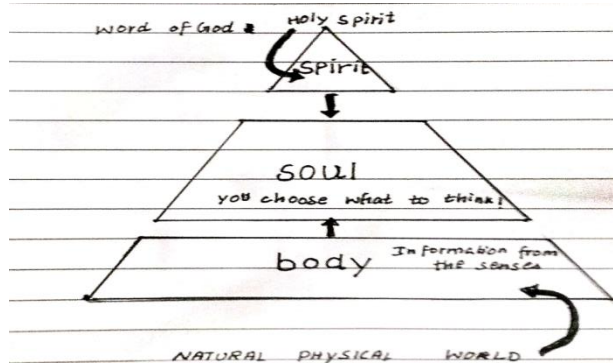

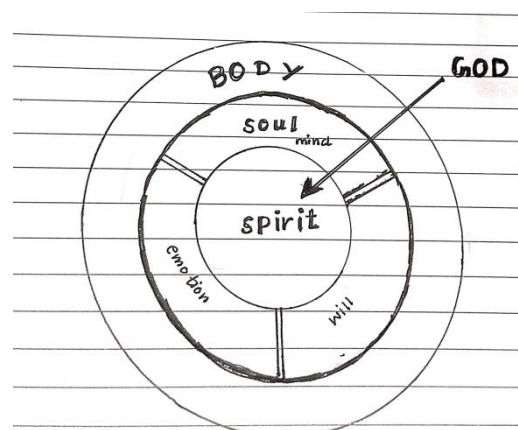
